Recap of 2016 National Results

Trump wins presidency and Electoral College (290-232, MI tbd), Clinton wins popular vote (~0.6%)

Republicans hold Senate (51-48-1tbd, +2D), House (241-194, +5D)

No state has split President-Senate outcome (1st time since voting for Senate began in 1914)

Recap of 2016 State Results

Republicans hold 66 of 98 partisan state legislative chambers

Democrats 30; 1 tie; 1 nonpartisan

Republicans control both chambers in 32 states (highest ever)

Republican governor in 33 states, Democrats have 15 (1 Ind, 1 tbd)








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
Most Important Issue Facing Country, Republican Contests




Most Important Issue Facing Country, Democratic Contests




Most Important Democratic Candidate Quality



Most Important Republican Candidate Quality




Percent of voters feeling "betrayed" by Republican Party politicians








Higher support among age 65+









Higher support among those deciding in past few days




Higher support among those deciding before past few days

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



Predictions from Models Mixed


Presumed Clinton advantages: money, demographics, ground game, higher turnout among higher educated

Presumed Trump advantages: time for a change, economy improved but modest, low presidential approval in 2015, Republican strength in states




Trump vs Clinton in National Polls





Economic anxiety: decades in the making


Cultural anxiety: issues, identity, values


Over 60% Say US on Wrong Track

White men: +32 pts Trump (+27 '12)

Black 18-29: +72 pts Clinton (+83 '12)

Latino 18-29: +46 pts Clinton (+51 '12)

White 18-29: +5 pts Trump (+7 '12)

Black 45-64: +81 pts Clinton (+86 '12)

Latino 45-64: +38 pts Clinton (+38 '12)

White 45-64: +29 pts Trump (+23 '12)





Precinct Results MN, 2016 & 2012 Compared

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
Wisconsin Presidential Results By County 2012 and 2016

Both parties need ways to address economic anxiety


Both will need to wrestle with “opportunity” and “security” – opposites? complements?

Trump as a “centrist,” working as a “third way” president (Eisenhower, Nixon, Clinton)?


